4. Clips, combs- Prior to riding you will learn the brushes and clean your horse thoroughly.
7. Horse Anatomy- We will discuss with you major parts of the horse and diseases/prevention.

After this lesson you will be better able to complete the other activities for the Horse Rider Badge.
